Materials You'll Need

- Worsted weight yarn (approximately 200 yards for the wrist warmers, 300 yards for the hat, and 400 yards for the neck warmer)

- Size US 7 (4.5mm) knitting needles
- Tapestry needle
- Scissors

Skill Level

Stitches Used

- Knit stitch (k)
- Purl stitch (p)
- Rib stitch (k1, p1)

Wrist Warmers

****Step 1: Cast On****

Cast on 30 stitches.

****Step 2: Knit Ribbing****

Work in rib stitch (k1, p1) for 2 inches.

****Step 3: Stockinette Stitch****

Switch to stockinette stitch (k all rows) and knit for 6 inches.

****Step 4: Ribbing****

Return to rib stitch (k1, p1) and work for 2 inches.

****Step 5: Bind Off****

Bind off all stitches.

****Step 6: Finishing****

Weave in any loose ends and seam the wrist warmers together, leaving a small opening for your thumb.

Hat

****Step 1: Cast On****

Cast on 104 stitches.

****Step 2: Ribbing****

Work in rib stitch (k1, p1) for 2 inches.

****Step 3: Decreasing****

Decrease 1 stitch at the beginning of every other row until you have 80 stitches remaining.

****Step 4: Stockinette Stitch****

Switch to stockinette stitch (k all rows) and knit for 6 inches.

****Step 5: Shaping the Crown****

Work in stockinette stitch, decreasing 1 stitch at the beginning of every 4th row until you have 12 stitches remaining.

****Step 6: Bind Off****

Bind off all stitches.

****Step 7: Finishing****

Weave in any loose ends and sew the top of the hat closed.

Neck Warmer

****Step 1: Cast On****

Cast on 120 stitches.

****Step 2: Ribbing****

Work in rib stitch (k1, p1) for 4 inches.

****Step 3: Stockinette Stitch****

Switch to stockinette stitch (k all rows) and knit for 10 inches.

****Step 4: Ribbing****

Return to rib stitch (k1, p1) and work for 4 inches.

****Step 5: Bind Off****

Bind off all stitches.

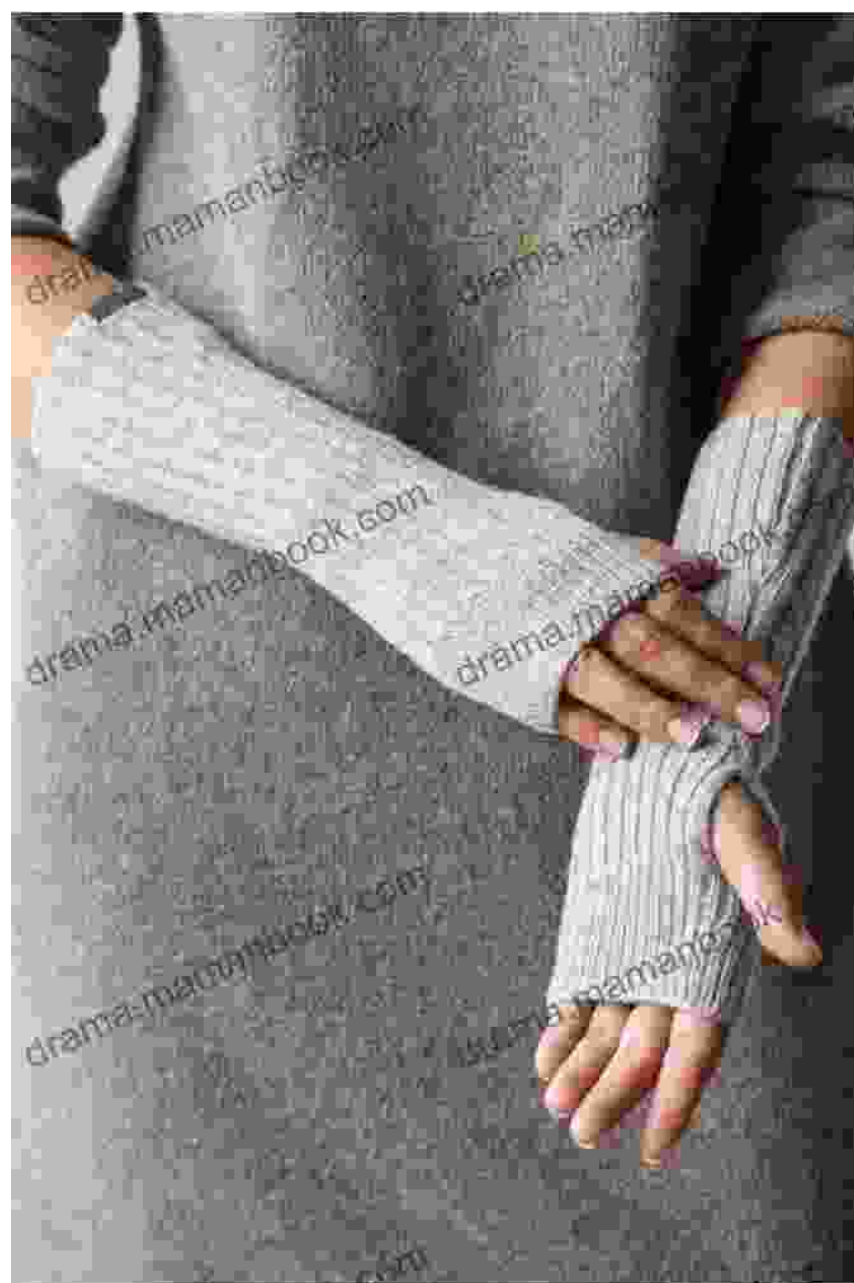
****Step 6: Finishing****

Weave in any loose ends and seam the neck warmer ends together.

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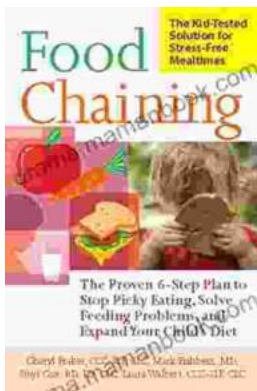
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
