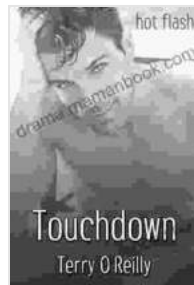


Meet Touchdown Hot Flash Terry Reilly: The Underrated Star of the 1980s

Terry Reilly was an American football player who played for the New York Giants in the National Football League (NFL) from 1982 to 1991. He was a member of the Giants team that won Super Bowl XXI in 1987. Reilly was known for his speed and agility, and was one of the most feared return specialists in the NFL.

Reilly was born in Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, on August 21, 1960. Reilly was recruited to play football at Penn State University, where he was a four-year letterman and a two-time All-American. He was also a member of the Nittany Lions' 1982 national championship team.

Reilly was drafted by the Giants in the first round of the 1982 NFL Draft. He quickly became a star for the Giants, and was a key member of the team's

offense and special teams. Reilly was a dangerous receiver out of the backfield, and was also a talented return specialist. He was one of the most feared players in the NFL, and was known for his ability to score touchdowns on both offense and special teams.

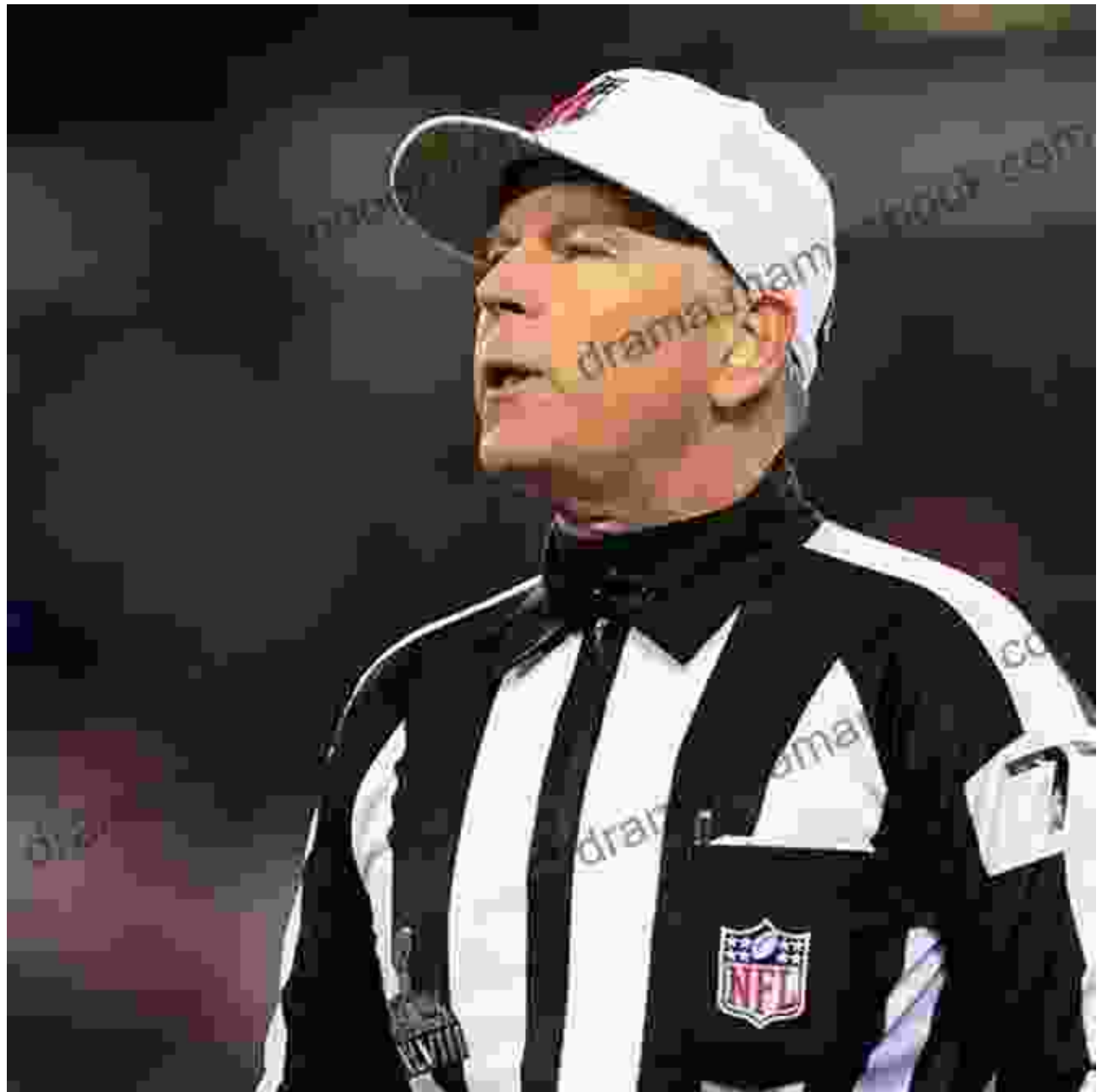

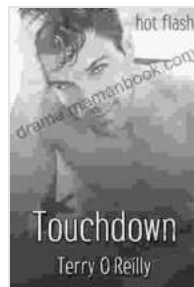
