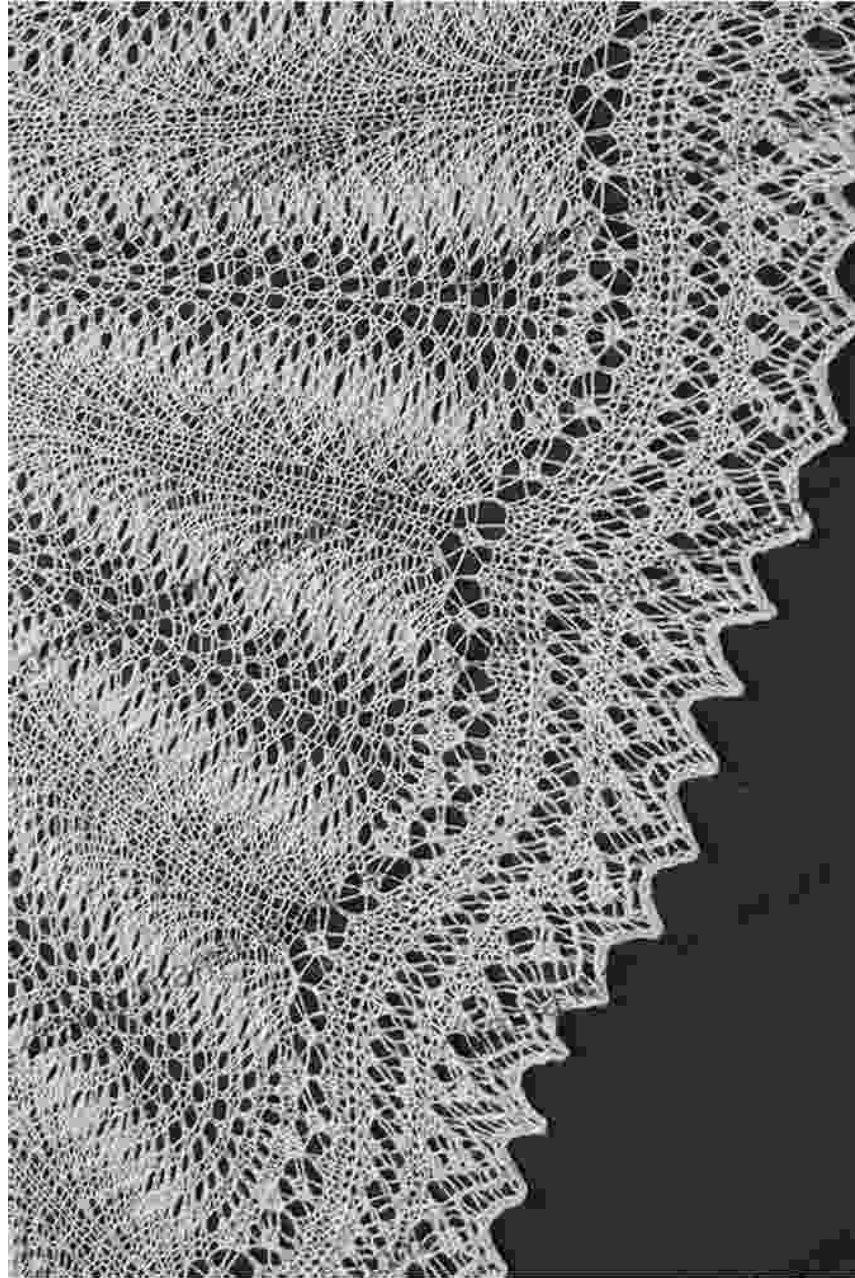


Image: Intricate Lace Details of the Old Shetland Lace Knitting Pattern

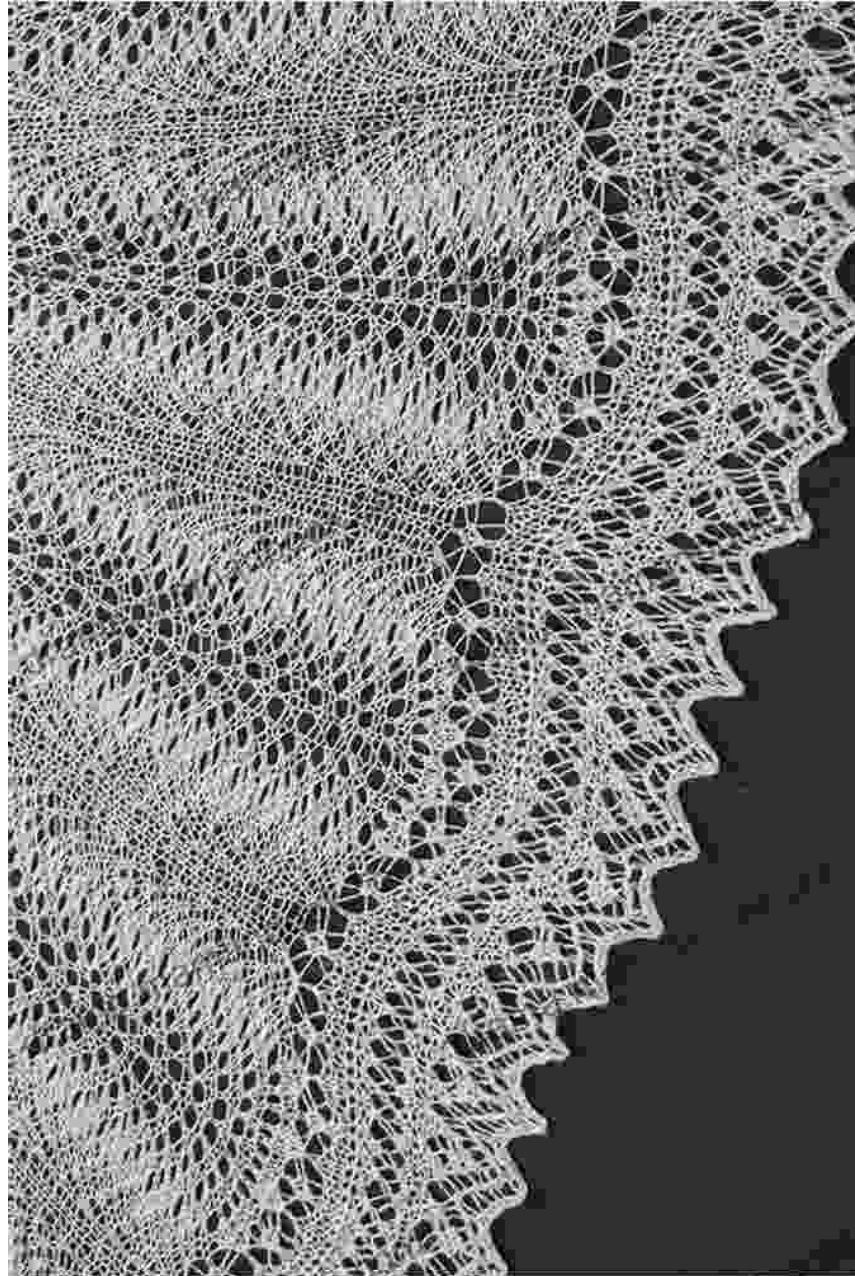


Image: Finished Old Shetland Lace Shawl

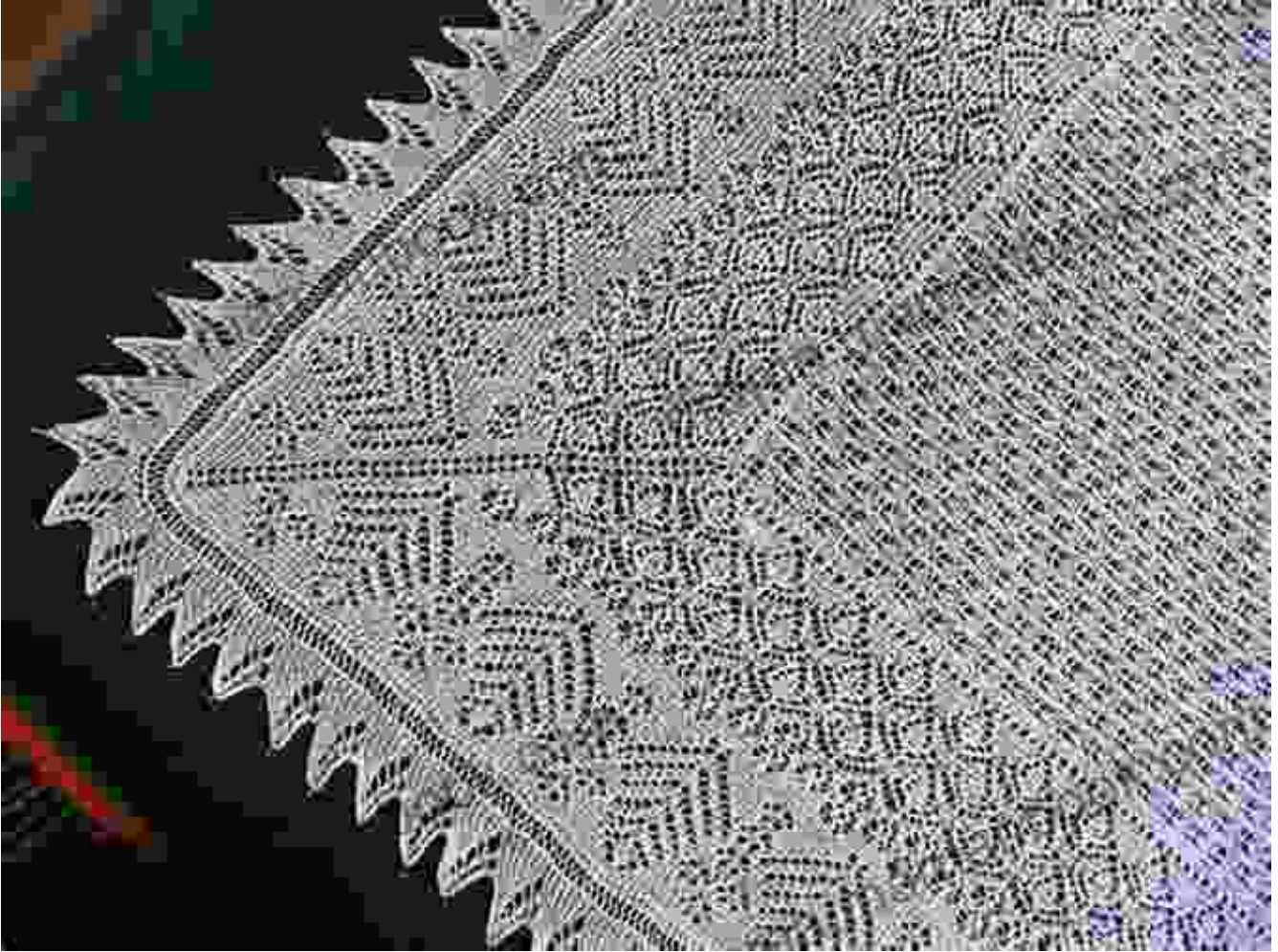


Image: Old Shetland Lace Knitting Pattern Instructions

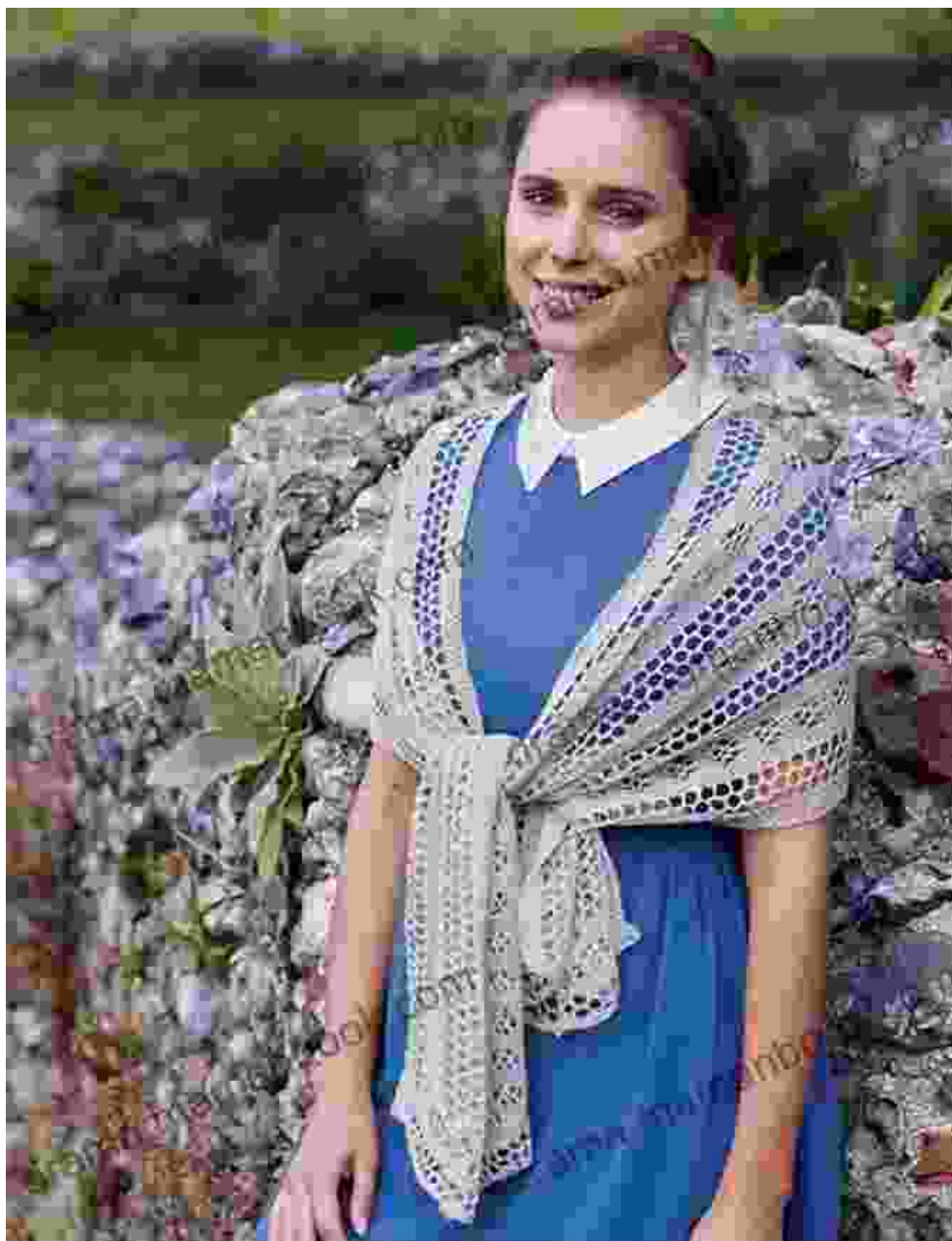


Image: Historical Image of Women Wearing Shetland Lace Shawls

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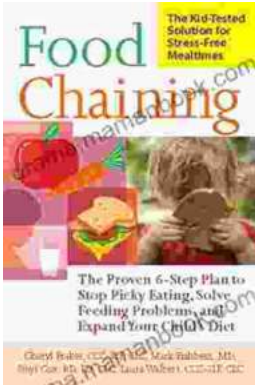
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
